Infant Development & Community Outreach Consultant (June 15, 2022- June 15, 2023) Richmond, BC - 37.5 hours weekly (\$33.83- 36.33 hourly)

This role will assist families/caregivers to support the development of their children (birth to 3 years old) by implementing play based strategies in their homes while also establishing partnerships with community agencies to connect families to these services; reducing barriers and building relationship for families accessing supports for their children.

YOUR IMPACT:

- Provide a family centered approach to case management, including receiving and responding to referrals and managing caseloads.
- Administer developmental screening/assessment tools to help monitor the child's development.
- Work alongside family/caregiver to create developmental goals.
- Identify and develop partnerships with community organizations serving the early years population to connect people with common interests with one another.
- Facilitate workshops and group sessions to provide information and education relating to development targeting the early years.
- Providing consultation for families by bridging them to early years programs and services; and when required assisting with kindergarten transition.
- Promotes a sense of belonging and inclusion for families /caregivers that have children that require extra support.

- Relevant university degree or college diploma in child development or related field and at least 3 years' experience supporting families and children with developmental disabilities in a similar environment.
- Current CPR and First Aid Certification.
